Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you had an enjoyable holiday and we would like welcome you all back for our final term of the year.

Reading at home.

This term we really want to encourage children to develop their enjoyment of reading. Here are some useful tips to help your child at home:

- 1. It's still good to share:** Reading to your child, listening to your child read, leaving them to read alone and listening to audio books are all valuable. Try to chat informally about reading and swap ideas about good reads – no pressure!
- 2. Keep opening up the world of reading:** Share the variety of your reading with your child: books, magazines, websites, and apps, to show how reading can help you to follow your interests and to get involved.
- 3. Valuing choice but nudging forward:** Children enjoy reading series' of books or books by the same author. This is very important however, over time it's a good idea to try to gently move them on to keep their reading experience fresh and broad
- 4. Join a reading club or library:** Many libraries offer the Summer Reading Challenge

P.E

Home learning

On Fridays, your child will continue to bring home spellings and a maths activity either on Mymaths or in their book. Spellings are tested weekly. The children will have a new learning grid that supports our topic for this term.

English

Science

In science this term the children will be learning about Living things and their habitats. They will be finding out about life cycles and reproduction. This also links to PSHE and the Sex and Relationships Education on Puberty.

Topic

The first half term the children will be studying local history through the Princess Alice Disaster. We will be going to the Greenwich Heritage Centre to find out more about the cause and effects of the disaster. In the second half of the term our geography topic is about Rivers. We will be going on a trip to Creekside in Deptford to take part in a river walk, measure the speed of a river and look at how the river contributes to the local area.
